Upon arrival, arrangements had previously been made for the transport of Al's Flag draped casket to the mortuary. The Family, with a Care Package of Food & Beverages available, were driven directly to their home in San Juan Capistrano by Mike.

Other Detachment Members came to Marilyn's aid to assist in the funeral arrangements and also help to make sure she received all the benefits to which she was entitled. Paperwork wise and administratively this was a challenge, but with a high degree of perseverance and determination, Marilyn and her Team of helpers prevailed.

In remembrance of AI, with broad representation by our Detachment, we provided Sprays of flowers for both the Funeral and Memorial Service. The Detachment also hosted a Family Dinner at the Cedar Creek Inn in San Juan for the Ehlow Family. With Marilyn's resilience, she in the true Ehlow tradition persevered and attended our Detachment BBQ at San Onofre Beach Camp Pendleton and the Cannons' 240th Marine Corps Birthday Dinner Celebration as our guest. True to the meaning of the words "Semper Fidelis," AI and his Family have never been forgotten.

The highpoint during the Fall was the Honor The Valor Football Game at Dana Hills HS where Bob Harhay was a Marine Veteran Team Captain who was honored along




